GENERAL

Rokeby School is a boys' independent school for pupils from ages 4+ to 13. Deciding on the right school for your child is very important, and we believe that a personal visit is invaluable. We very much hope that you and your son will visit Rokeby School. We hold a number of coffee mornings throughout the school year and at least one Open Day during the Autumn Term, which gives a general introduction to the school. ENTRY PROCEDURE

Entry at 4+

Boys can be registered on the School waiting list at any time from birth. The cost of registration, which includes a visit to the school, is £100.00 and is non-refundable. Eighteen months prior to entry, at the beginning of March, a ballot is drawn. Before being entered into the ballot there are certain requirements that need to be fulfilled. Boys must be registered and parents must have visited the school by 28th February, prior to the ballot taking place for their son's year of entry, i.e. eighteen months before the September when he will start. The first 44 names out of the hat will be offered places, with siblings being given priority (provided that the older sibling is doing well at Rokeby). All further names will be drawn out and placed on a waiting list. All places offered will be subject to a positive nursery report and a positive experience at the school's 'Discovery Morning' where boys have an opportunity to spend some time at the school. Please note: this is not a formal assessment.

Once offered a place, parents or guardians must within two weeks of the date of offer, sign and return the Acceptance of Offer Letter and pay a deposit of £2,500. Half of the deposit will be deducted from the first term's fees and the rest will be held as a deposit until your son leaves the school. After acceptance of a place if the required notice is not given in accordance with the Parent Contract, the deposit will be offset against any fees or fees in lieu of notice that are owing or outstanding.

If we have not heard after the two-week deadline we will automatically assume that the offer is not required and the place will be offered to the first person on the Waiting List.

As mentioned, Rokeby School will ask for a nursery report. Should we find the report raises concerns, we will investigate these and endeavour to ensure we are all in agreement on the correct pathway for your son, as we want him to thrive with us.

Rokeby is a high-achieving school with an impressive academic record, that does its very best to help all boys in every year group to achieve their potential. Parents will be kept informed of their son's progress throughout his time at Rokeby. Progress through the School is conditional on pupils achieving good standards of learning. In the event that a boy is not achieving the standards required, parents will be contacted by the School, to discuss their son's academic progress and a plan of action for improvement, usually by way of additional support, will be offered. However, on occasion, it may be necessary for parents to seek an alternative school where their son will thrive. We will always work with you to ensure any move is handled with sensitivity. Rokeby does hope and expect that all boys entering the school at four will remain until 13.

Entry at 7+ or later

For entry into all year groups, but especially at 7+ and 8+, the school operates a waiting list for external candidates. Key points of entry are at 7+ and 8+ years.

For 7+ entry a boy must have reached the age of 7 prior to September Ist in the year of entry. For 8+ entry a boy must have reached the age of 8 prior to September Ist in the year of entry.

Boys can be registered on the School waiting list at any time from birth. The cost of registration, which includes a visit to the school, is £100.00 and is non-refundable.

Entry to the School at 7+ or 8+ is based on the entrance examinations held in the November prior to the year of entry. All external candidates for entry to the School at 7+ or 8+ sit an assessment.

The fee for the external candidates to sit an assessment is £100. This fee is non-refundable.

There is a maximum of fifty-four places (of which priority is given to the boys already in the school) available at the 7+ entry level in each academic year. However, there are extra places available to external candidates at this entry point which are typically between 10 and 15 places.

Once offered an occasional place in the School (such as at 7+ or 8+), parents or guardians must, within two weeks of the date of offer, sign and return the Acceptance of Offer Letter and pay a deposit of £2,500. Half of the deposit will be deducted from the first term's fees and the rest will be held as a deposit until your son leaves the school.

After acceptance of a place, if the required notice is not given in accordance with the Parent Contract, the deposit will be offset against any fees or fees in lieu of notice that are owing or outstanding.

If we have not heard after the two-week deadline we will automatically assume that the offer is not required and the place will be offered to the first person on the Waiting List.

Occasional Places

From time to time a place becomes available within other Year Groups or at other times of the year. Boys are assessed for these places, in English and Maths and often verbal and non-verbal reasoning. Entry may be into the school in September or at another time agreed with the Headmaster. For boys entering Year 6 and above, a senior school discussion with parents will be included as part of the process. A reference from the present school will always be sought, usually before the boy has been assessed.

Please note:

We do understand that parents may wish to move their son from one local independent school to another. However, we do ask that an open and honest discussion is held with the present school's Head to avoid difficulty.

EQUAL TREATMENT

Our aim is to encourage applications from candidates with as diverse a range of backgrounds as possible. This enriches our community and is vital in preparing our boys for today's world. Bursaries are available in order to make it possible for as many as possible who meet the school's admission criteria to attend the school (see below). Parents should advise us at the time of application of any intention to apply for a Bursary.

Rokeby School is committed to equal treatment for all, regardless of a candidate's race, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation, gender reassignment or social background.

SPECIAL EDUCATIONAL NEEDS

We do not unlawfully discriminate in any way regarding entry. We welcome boys with special educational needs, providing that our Learning Support Department can offer them the support they require (there may be an additional charge for this support). We welcome boys with physical disabilities provided that our site can support their needs. However, we require parents of children with learning difficulties or physical disabilities to discuss their child's requirements with the School before he sits the assessment so that we can make adequate provision for him. Parents should provide a copy of an Educational Psychologist's report or a Medical Report to support their request: for example for extra time or other special arrangements.

We will discuss thoroughly with parents and their medical advisers or psychologists, the adjustments that can reasonably be made for the child if he becomes a pupil at the School.

There may be exceptional circumstances in which we are not able to offer a place for reasons relating to a child's disability. For example, if, despite reasonable adjustments, we feel that a prospective pupil is not going to be able to access the education offered, or that their health and safety or the health, safety and/or education the education of other pupils or the health and safety of staff may be put at risk, we may not be able to offer a place at the School.

THE ASSESSMENT PROCESS

Our assessment process is designed to be in keeping with our core values of kindness and a culture of happiness and support. The aim of the process is to identify potential, especially as the boys are relatively young at entry. The school has strong traditions in Music, Drama, Art, Debating and Sport as well as a strong Academic core. There are many extra-curricular activities, all of which are important in developing a well-balanced, confident individual.

No specific preparation for the entrance examinations is needed. All candidates start on an equal footing, with identical opportunities to display their academic aptitude.

Other than for Reception (4+ entry), candidates sit papers in aspects of English, Maths and verbal and non-verbal reasoning, that are appropriate for their age group and applicable to those from a variety of educational backgrounds.

We will advise parents of the dates of the assessments as part of the admissions process. We will offer places to candidates from our waiting list after the closing date for acceptances as quickly as possible.

We welcome boys from state-maintained primary schools to apply and will make allowances for them where the experience, or content, of the assessment is unfamiliar.

SIBLING POLICY

Most male siblings join us at Rokeby School. However, admission is not automatic, and there may be occasions where we judge that a sibling is likely to thrive better in a different academic environment. We will ask for a sibling above the 4+ entry point to take an entry assessment.

OUT OF YEAR

Occasionally parents may wish for their son to join the school out of his normal year or late within the year (for example summer-born boys joining Reception). The school is sympathetic to such requests and assesses this possibility on a case-by-case basis. In the case of summer-born boys, we do make some allowances in the assessment process.

INTERNAL AWARDS

The School offers its' most able pupils internal awards given every two years after an internal selection process for transition into Years 5 and 7. The value of these awards is £100 and they may be given for achievement in the Academic arena, Art, Design Technology, Drama, Music or Sport. It is hoped that the recipient will use the award to further his area of skill and even to seek to leave a legacy for the school. We also hold our own internal scholarship awards in certain academic subjects for boys in Years 7 and 8

BURSARIES/FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Our bursary programme is designed to make it possible for as many as possible of those who meet Rokeby School's entry criteria to take up a place here. We offer means tested awards annually to entrants at the 7+ entry, where the parents have indicated on the registration form that they require financial support. Bursaries are means-tested and each case is reviewed individually by the Finance Committee. Both parents are required to complete a bursary application form and provide evidence of their income and assets. The Bursary application is assessed by a third party company who may visit the family home or have a virtual meeting with the parents. The third party company makes a recommendation to the school, but it is the governors decision as to whether they make an award and the level of any such award as they also consider the academic ability of your son. The level of support varies according to parental need; but can extend to full fee remission or a % remission in cases of proven need.

Bursaries are typically offered for 12 months at a time. The family is required to provide fresh information about their circumstances for every year that their son attends the School. Levels of support may vary with fluctuations in income. However, if there is no change in the family's circumstances it would be expected that the school would continue to support your son on an ongoing basis subject to making suitable academic progress as well.

Bursaries are only offered to families who are resident in the UK.

The School's expectation is that parents who do not choose to apply for a bursary at the time that their son is being assessed, will not require financial support throughout the time that their son attends the school, except due to wholly unforeseen circumstances.
